A Note From Father John

Thank you for reading this report --a summary of some of the things that happened here at St. Andrew's in the past 12 months. While it contains a lot of numbers and statistics, it only hints at the number of lives that have been affected by what we are doing here as the People of God. It does NOT name the number of confessions, the number of hospital, home, and nursing home visits, the number of people who returned to the church after many years, or the number of people who were touched by your kindness, generosity, and compassion – especially through your outreach through Brown Bag, Western Wake, St. Vincent de Paul, Birth Choice, Haiti Goat, and so many others.

I am grateful to those who have embraced stewardship with all three T's – Time, Talent, and Treasure, which is what makes all of this possible. I remain disappointed that so many of our parishioners give nothing, or next to nothing. We currently have 2546 registered households, and 1394 of them donated AT LEAST ONCE to the offertory (not very impressive!) during the last fiscal year. Which means that 1152 households donated NOTHING, hard to believe. (And let's not lie that we give cash – which would mean that all of the non-givers are giving about a penny a week!) If gratitude is the heart of the spiritual life, one has to ask if there is any sense of gratitude for all that has been given to every one of us? And yet these same non-giving families will ask me to go to the hospital to visit, preside at their family funerals, and baptize their children. They will have children in our catechetical programs and absorb the heat/ac, light and all the other amenities that our parish offers. Where is a basic sense of justice? Fairness? What does being a disciple of Jesus mean? Or are they just 'takers' at the banquet of life, making it all about them?

Also, if we are giving \$5 or \$10 a week, and feel that is acceptable as an offering for all that God has done for us, I think we are sadly mistaken. My father was giving \$5 a week in the 1950's --with 5 children, and working as a school teacher! He and my mother were both involved in the parish, and helping neighbors in need. Our summer garden produce was shared with everyone in the neighborhood. Take an honest look at the PERCENT of your income that you are giving, and resolve to give at least 2% this year, and raise it 1% every year until you reach the 10%. I assure you that you will never even miss it – and you will also feel good about being honest in your stewardship. And with a sense of gratitude, comes a sense of peace.

Here is a piece that might prompt some prayerful reflection:

WHAT IF?

What if God couldn't take time to bless us today, because we couldn't take the time to thank Him yesterday?

What if God decided to stop leading us tomorrow, because we didn't follow Him today?

What if God didn't walk with us today, because we failed to recognize it as His day?

What if we never saw another flower bloom, because we grumbled when God sent the rain?

What if God stopped loving and caring for us because we failed to love and care for others?

What if God took away the Bible tomorrow, because we wouldn't read it today?

What if God took away His message, because we failed to listen to His messenger?

What if the church was closed, because we never opened our wallets or our hearts?

What if God answered our prayers the way we answer His call to serve?

What if God met our needs the way we give Him our lives?

- As of June 30, St. Andrew has 2,546 registered families with 180 of those being new to the parish this fiscal year.

BISHOPS ANNUAL APPEAL

The Bishop's Annual Appeal is our yearly opportunity to support the work of the Catholic Church in Eastern North Carolina. So far this year



we have raised over \$390,000, more than \$82,000 over our 2024 goal of \$311,097. 673 donors (around 26% of our households) gave

an average contribution of \$399. Over \$32,000 (40% of the total amount over our goal at the end of the year) will be returned directly to our parish in 2025.

Financial Summary

September 2024

Thanks be to God! Our parish has once again done wonderful things with time, talent, and treasure.

Thank you, our faithful stewards, for your financial support that makes the work our parish does possible. We are planning to exceed tithing levels of charitable giving in the next fiscal year, as you will see later in this report. We built our new bell towers to call us to prayer, and recreated the CARE center garden in memory of our founder Fr. Bill Schmidt. We have done this and a lot of "unseen" maintenance – all while we remain debt free.



Expense Summary 2023-2024



Faith Formation

FAITH FORMATION PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE

For Elementary Students, Middle Schoolers, High Schoolers, and Their Families



Although parishes are called to support families in growing in love and knowledge of God, they are not meant to be a replacement for the family. We cannot outsource our faith. Rather, it is best rooted in and nurtured by our families.

The goal of the Families Encountering Christ Formation Program is to help all of us know Jesus through prayer, Scripture, service, and liturgical living. Components of the program include grade-level catechesis and family groups that will meet at the parish monthly to accompany each other in faith sharing and prayer in fun and engaging ways throughout the program year.

Service projects and GRACE events/socials will be available throughout the year to all families.

Other Formation Opportunities:

The Special Needs and Disabilities Ministry at St. Andrew builds a coalition of social and spiritual support within the Diocese of Raleigh. Families aren't just welcome in our church - they belong here. Those with disabilities are invited to participate in all areas of parish life including the liturgy and faith formation programs. Support is tailored to individuals' gifts and needs.

Adult Faith Formation includes a year-round Inquiry and Catechumenate for RCIA, preparation of adult Catholics for Confirmation, and a Returning Catholics program. Catechist formation and enrichment is offered through short courses throughout the year. Several small groups meet throughout the week for faith sharing and/or Bible Study, including both virtual and in-person opportunities. FORMED, an on-line streaming service, is also available to all parishioners. *Word on Fire*, another online service, has also been introduced to parishioners.



Early Childhood Center

St. Andrew ECC provides a Christ-centered and nurturing environment where developmentally appropriate, play-based learning opportunities focus on social-emotional, physical, and cognitive development.



St. Andrew's Early Childhood Center offers a half day, nine-month program where children ages 18 months through 5 years old can learn and grow in a nurturing, faith-filled environment. The developmentally appropriate curriculum is designed to enhance social, emotional, physical, and intellectual growth in young children. Child initiated and teacher supported play is an essential component of the program. Being a Catholic center, Bible stories, prayer, and Catholic identity are incorporated into daily lessons. As of September 3, 2024 the preschool enrollment for the 2024-2025 school is at 95% capacity. The center is fully staffed. Eighty-one of the students (58%) enrolled are Catholic with 46% being St. Andrew parishioners.
